## HOW TO SCORE YOUR MOVE

## Sample Score Sheet 1

## The Score Sheet is filled out if the following

 tiles are played.Yellow player starts by multiplying the starting score of 11 by 3 resulting in a score of 33 . The yellow x3 tile is placed on the corresponding white board space as shown below.


White player adds 2 to the starting score of 11 equalling 13. Places tile on the yellow board and records the score as shown on the score sheet.
*Note 13 is a Prime Number which makes a move more difficult for the White player.

In the next play, Yellow multiplies his own score by 7 and also decides to use his Red $D$ in the same move. Resulting score is 462.

* D tiles are only used with the same colour
number tile.


White player then attacks Yellow players score by dividing the score of 462 by 3.
*This score is entered on the white side of the score sheet because the white score is changed.

Next move BLACK multiplies his score by 3 and the game continues.

## Sample Score Sheet 2

How to use the Blue D

White player is on a score of 328 and is now White's turn to play.

The D tile can be used by first using another tile of the same colour in the same move.

This example uses the Blue -3 and Blue D
328-3=325
325 doubled is $\mathbf{6 5 0}$
